

CIA. PEPA PLANA PRESENTS



The rebel, Albert Camus tells us, is a man who says 'No'. The clown, on the other hand, is a bewildered man who spends his time disturbing the established order by firing impertinent questions at the world – impertinent, of course, and yet insidiously pertinent at the same time.

In this show, Pepa Plana is a rhapsodic, perplexed, coquettish and rather low-down clown offering to take us on a trip through the realms of universal poetry, helping to heighten the atmospheric turbulence with a handful of questions: What's the sex life of Chinese people like? Is his lordship the poet a criminal holding no liability for the tribulations of those he begets?

I like poetry a lot, says Pepa just before she dives into the first poem armed to the teeth with questions.

This is the first spectacle of the clown Pepa Plana. Premiered in 1998 with great success of critic and the public, and 8 months the season at Sala Muntaner Barcelona and one toured around Spain, and more 200 functions and is still currently running.

"De Pe a Pa", directed by Joan Busquets meant the emergence of clown Pepa Plana, one of the first women who dared to wear a red nose, on the Catalan scene. In addition, the spectacle was awarded the FAD-Sebastia Gasch Applause in 1999.

Composed of a series of sketches that begin with a memorable and hilarious parody of Joan Maragall's poem 'La Vaca Cega' (The Blind Cow) in 'De Pe a Pa' Pepa Plana turns herself into a poet and a rhapsody, irreverent, but full of humanity. She tells us a Chinese story, she dialogues with a potato and she also shows us how cruel can become people's existence.

Trajectory Company____

Pepa Plana, Catalan actress and clown, born in Valls, Tarragona, May 2, 1965, a reference in the genre for the quality of its performances and its contribution to the display of clowns, standing as one of European figures. She is a women clown who comes from the world of acting. Graduated in Performing Arts from "Institut del teatre de Barcelona" 1989.

Pepa Plana establishes her company in 1998 with a clear intention to create clown theatre for adult audiences. "**De Pe a Pa**", the company's first production that quickly achieved recognition in the Catalan theatre scene, marks the starting point of her career as a female clown.

Two years later she presents "**Giulietta**"(2000), a revision of Shakespeare's classic Romeo and Juliet that consolidates her in the theatre circuits.

With a desire to open up new horizons she then creates "Hatzàrdia"(2004) a play that marks the starting point of her journey into the world of theatre without text, and which is quickly followed by "L'atzar"(2004) a follow-up play with a simpler staging that facilitates travelling and allows her to present it worldwide.

But it is her following play "**Penèlope**"(2010) which fully enables her objective of travelling extensively with a revision of Penelope and Ulysses myth.

With "**Èxode**"(2011) – a play that looks into the hardship of human migration caused by political and economical reasons, she shares the stage with two other renowned clowns for the first time. Along with the recognition of the public she has also been granted numerous awards.

Is in 2012 she begins a new stage in her career together with the Cirque du Soleil with the creation of "**Amaluna**", the new production of the prestigious company from Quebec.

And with **"Despistats"** (2014) together with Toti Toronell begins in the street theatre to open another window to look the world.



"Paradise Painted" was premiered July 14, 2016 as part of the Grec Festival of Barcelona. A funny proposal of a visual richness that dresses up in poetry, the sadder side of migrations.

And finally **"Suite",** a new street proposal, premiered at the "Teatro sin Teatro" Festival of Rubí in June 2017.

Pepa Plana's trajectory has lead her to become the most recognised Catalan female clown in Spain and around the world, and her work has opened up a new possibilities in the theatrical panorama, generating wide expectation and anticipation with each of her new projects.

Pepa Plana has also been artistic director of the International Festival of Clowns Andorra, absolute benchmark of the genre biennial event since the first edition in 2001 to the last in 2009.

This 2014 has been awarded with the prestigious **National Cultural** Award 2014

Other spectacles_

Starting from Tibor Harsányi's score – Hungarian composer and pianist that in 1950 wrote the musical adaptation of the Brothers Grimm tale – the Granollers Chamber Orchestra interprets the score and Pepa Plana tells the story in a free adaptation. Through an ingenuous, daring, tender and unashamed gaze, the endearing clown uses her chameleonic talents to make us relive the tale as if we heard it for the first time. The musical score, which is interpreted by 8 instrumentalists of the Granollers Chamber Orchestra conducted by Francesc Guillén, accompanies and wraps up Pepa Plana's words and gestures. The stage direction is by Pep Bou.

This is the first time that Pepa Plana participates in a production that it is not mainly aimed for adult audiences. It premiered at the Teatre Auditori of Granollers followed by an extensive tour throughout Catalonia during the 2006/2007 and 2007/2008 seasons.

This production by the Escena Nacional d'Andorra is an adaptation of the 1947 classic play by Tennessee Williams based on a revision of the character "Blanche", that Pepa Plana interprets with all her experience and baggage of female clowning.

In a world of actors, this clown emerges with all her innocence, but with the conviction that the others are those going in the opposite direction. As the director of the production says: "she liberates us from psychoanalytical readings and the excessively restrictive interpretative clichés".

It premiered at the Teatre Comunal of Andorra la Vella on the 14 and 15 of November 2008, followed by a season at the Sala Muntaner in Barcelona during January 2009.
